We are monitoring the storm track carefully, and making preparations to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community. Updates and changes will be posted on South Bay's social media pages, southbaycity.com, and shared through local media. As a reminder, City offices were already scheduled to be closed in observance of Labor Day on September 2, 2019. City services will continue once the ALL CLEAR has been given by Palm Beach County Emergency Operations Officials.

While the storm is getting closer and its path is uncertain, we are taking every action we can to prepare the City and keep our residents safe.

WASTE COLLECTION DISCONTINUED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE AND THE WASTE YARD IS CLOSED.

We urge all residents to PULL THEIR WASTE CONTAINERS FROM THE CURBSIDE:

DO NOT do any major yard work until after the storm passes.

DO NOT place any debris at the curb until the storm has cleared.

YOUR ASSISTANCE IS NEEDED TO REMOVE ANY DEBRIS FROM THE CURB. This debris could become dangerous in a Tropical Storm Force Winds
